Located in the heart of British Columbia's interior, surrounded by the fascinating, hillside landscape of Canada's only semi-arid desert, Kamloops is one of the hubs of the province. The name itself, Kamloops, is derived from a Shuswap Indian word meaning "meeting place," referring to the joining of the North and South Thompson Rivers on which the town is located. Please note that all accommodations in Kamloops, while charming, are of moderate standard and cannot be upgraded.

At the heart of the Canadian Rockies' rugged peaks and rushing rivers, surrounded by the spectacular landscape of the UNESCO World Heritage site and four adjoining parks, lies the town of Banff. Banff offers culture, steaming mineral hot springs, and countless walking options, like along the banks of the Bow River.

The main attraction to Lake Louise, for many, is the sparkling turquoise lake itself. The beautiful, milky blue lake rests at the foot of Victoria Glacier, which rises majestically behind, capped by snow and ice year-round. First sighted by Europeans in 1882, the lake has become one of Canada's best-loved sights and the most photographed scene in the Canadian Rockies.

On the edge of the Rocky Mountains' rolling foothills lies a cosmopolitan city with friendly western hospitality. Prosperous, clean, and safe, Calgary was the site of the 1988 Olympic Winter Games, is home to the Olympic Hall of Fame and the annual Calgary Stampede, and offers live theatre, museums, art galleries and major-league sports.
