Southern Africa Day-by-Day

Monday, August 26th - Today, we will fly overnight to Cape Town, South Africa. Dinner will be provided during the flight.

<u>Tuesday</u>, <u>August 27</u>th - Upon arrival, we will transfer by coach to our hotel. The rest of the day is at your leisure and a light dinner will be provided by the hotel.

Wednesday. August 28th - After an orientation meeting with your Tour Manager, depart on a half day Cape Town city and Table Mountain tour. Driving to the city center, pass famous landmarks such as the Castle of Good Hope (built in 1666 by the Dutch East India Company) and City Hall, a splendid baroque building, and the Grand Parade. See St. George's Cathedral, the Anglican Diocese of Nobel Peace Laureate Archbishop Desmond Tutu. Pass the Company Gardens and the Malay Quarter. The route then leads to Kloof Nek and the magnificent Table Mountain. Ascend to the top (weather permitting) by means of a cable car. At the summit, see wildflowers, the famous silver tree, and marvel at a birds-eye view of the city and its beaches. On a clear day, it is even possible to see Robben Island, where Nelson Mandela was imprisoned, on one side, and Cape Point on the other. Descend from the upper cableway station and proceed to the Milnerton Lighthouse. Later, you will have the opportunity to learn the three-billion-year-old story of diamonds while touring the prominent Shimansky Jewelers & Museum at Cape Town's famous V & A Waterfront. The 45-minute tour reveals the origins of diamond mining and includes explanations of color, cut and clarity. Following the tour, stroll through the adjacent V & A Shopping Mall with its endless shopping and dining opportunities before returning to your hotel. This evening enjoy a Welcome Dinner with your Tour Manager and fellow travelers.

Thursday. August 29th - Depart on a full day Cape Peninsula Tour with lunch along the way. Drive to Cape Point at the southwestern tip of the Cape Peninsula, passing steep mountains, secluded coves, and sweeping beaches en route. After a stop at the fishing village of Hout Bay, one of Cape Town's best-kept secrets, continue to the Cape of Good Hope Nature Reserve, comprising over 17,300 acres of indigenous flora and fauna, where you may see baboons by the roadside, rheboks, cape mountain zebras, bonteboks and the elusive eland. The native plant life, known as fynbos, forms one of only six floral kingdoms in the world. Following the coastline along False Bay, return to Cape Town after lunch by way of Simon's Town. Here, visit the penguin colonies at Boulders Beach, and continue with a scenic drive over Muizenberg Mountain. Lastly, visit the Kirstenbosch National Botanical Gardens, resting at the foot of Table Mountain, for a short walking tour of the beautiful gardens before returning to Cape Town.

Optional - Dinner Experience: Shaamiela Samodien - Bo Kaap Home Hosted Experience
 Shaamiela will take you by the hand and lead you into her kitchen. After a refreshing drink, you are given instructions and before you know it, you're in the midst of the delightful Cape Malay cooking course! Day-by-Day in Detail (continued)

Friday, August 30th - Today is a full day at leisure to explore Cape Town or join an optional tour:

- Optional Wine Tram Group Experience
 The Group Experience is a unique & leisurely way to see the Franschhoek & Groot Drakenstein Valleys, as the journey through rolling vineyards, stopping at some of South Africa's oldest and most distinguished wine estates. The itinerary covers up to three wine estates, each with a character as rich & individual as the wines they produce. At each estate, a premium tasting is included. S199 per person
- Optional Dinner Experience: GOLD Restaurant Interactive Djembe Drumming and 14-Course Africa Feast GOLD Restaurant is often referred to as a 'Taste Safari' and it lives up to the name. This vibrant restaurant promises an evening of wining & dining in scintillating African style. The dinner begins with the drumbeat of djembe drum and interactive drum circle. You will then be led into the courtyard for a hand-washing ceremony before the feast begins. This 14-course set menu is authentically Cape Malay & African cuisine, while you are entertained by live performances near your table. <u>Saturday, August 31</u>st - This morning, transfer to the airport for our flight to Durban. Upon arrival this morning, drive to St. Lucia for lunch, then embark on a game viewing cruise through the St. Lucia Estuary. This tidal estuary is home to Nile crocodiles, hippopotamus, sea turtles, and even sharks, making it a fascinating and uniquely diverse ecosystem. This evening, enjoy dinner at the hotel.

<u>Sunday, September 1</u>st - After an early breakfast, travel to the Hluhluwe-Imfolozi Game Reserve, situated in northern KwaZulu Natal, which contains an immense diversity of fauna and flora and is particularly famous for its conservation of black and white rhinos. Home to Africa's "Big Five," you may have a chance to see elephants, Cape buffalo, lion and leopard, in addition to rhino during your morning game drive through the reserve. The park also boasts warthog, crocodile, and antelope. Following the safari, continue to the border of the Kingdom of eSwatini. This independent kingdom within the borders of South Africa is known for its lovely scenery and vibrant indigenous culture. Stop at a safari lodge for an included lunch, then continue to our hotel. This evening, dinner at the hotel is provided.

Monday, September 2nd - After breakfast, transfer to the South African border and visit Matsamo Cultural Village where you can learn more about the Swazi traditions and customs. Enjoy traditional dance and song performances with authentic African instruments as well as traditional Swazi cuisine. You may wander through the village with its many traditional huts and interact with the locals. Later, continue to the hotel. After lunch, embark on an afternoon safari in Kruger National Park. Return to the hotel this evening for dinner.

<u>Tuesday, September 3rd</u> - The day begins at dawn with breakfast, coffee, tea, and rusks, a South African dry biscuit. Then, on to Kruger National Park for a thrilling full day open-vehicle game drive. Larger than the state of Connecticut, the park offers some of the best game and wildlife viewing opportunities in the world, and early morning is an optimal time of day. You may have a chance to see lion, elephant, giraffe, or zebra in their natural habitat. After stopping at a rest camp for lunch, continue your game drive. With any luck, you may even see cheetah and leopard. After the day's excitement, relax by the pool and enjoy dinner at the hotel.


<u>Wednesday, September 4th</u> - Depart after breakfast and travel to Mpumalanga Province, known as "Paradise Country," driving the spectacular "Panorama Route." Stop to admire the views of amazing scenery along the 16-mile-long Blyde River Canyon, cut deep into red sandstone, and God's Window (weather permitting), a breathtaking vista at the edge of the escarpment overlooking Kruger National Park. Visit Bourke's Luck Potholes, a series of waterfalls and distinctive rock formations created by countless millennia of water erosion. Lunch is provided before proceeding this afternoon to Johannesburg. Dinner is included this evening at the hotel.

Day-by-Day in Detail (continued)

<u>Thursday, September 5th</u> - After an early breakfast, depart on a half day tour of Soweto. Experience a fascinating glimpse of the bustling neighborhood life of Soweto, the most metropolitan township in the country, setting trends in politics, fashion, music, dance and language. Drive by the former residence of Bishop Desmond Tutu and visit Nelson Mandela's former home. Continue to the Apartheid Museum, where you will journey through the racial segregation experienced by millions of South Africans, and Constitution Hill, a living museum that tells the story of South Africa's journey to democracy. Lunch is included during today's tour of Soweto. This evening enjoy a Farewell Dinner with your Tour Manager and fellow travelers.

Friday, September 6th - Today, we will fly overnight to Columbus. Dinner will be provided during the flight.

Saturday, September 7th - We will arrive in Columbus today.



Victoria Falls Post-Tour (Optional)

<u>Friday, September 6th</u> - This morning, transfer to the airport for our flight to Livingstone, Zambia. Following hotel check-in, enjoy an afternoon at leisure - The Zambian side of Victoria Falls is a 5-minute walk from the hotel & admission is included. Return to the hotel this evening for a delicious dinner.

Saturday, September 7th - No surprise why Victoria Falls is one of the seven Natural Wonders of the World. You'll understand it instantly as we tour the Zimbabwean side, for there are numerous spectacular vantage points along the width of the Falls, and the sight of this astounding gift of nature, simply takes your breath away. Walk through the permanent, beautifully misty rainforest which flanks the Falls, stopping to marvel at the principal sites as it cascades to the depths below the Main Falls, Horseshoe Falls, Rainbow Falls, the Boiling Pot, Cataract Island and Livingstone Island. We'll stand and watch, feel and listen to the spray and thunderous noise, as millions of liters of water tumble over the Falls into a series of narrow gorges below. The seventh Natural Wonder of the World puts on the most dramatic show for you, and you'll be privileged to have watched it. Today will include an approximately 1 ½- 2 hour walking tour and lunch at a restaurant overlooking the Zambezi River. This evening, get a different perspective during a beautiful Sunset Dinner Cruise.

Sunday, September 8th - Today, we will fly overnight to Columbus. Dinner will be provided during the flight.

Monday, September 9th - We will arrive in Columbus today.

Common Questions & Hotel Information

WHAT DOCUMENTS DO I NEED? Visitors to South Africa must have a passport that is valid for at least 6 months after the intended departure date. Passports should also have a minimum of two blank passport pages per country visited. The blank pages cannot include the endorsement page at the back of the book. If there is insufficient space in the passport, entry into a country could be denied. If you require a visa, you must ensure that your passport has two blank facing pages - one for the visa and one for the entry stamp. Visitors who intend on traveling to South Africa's neighboring countries and back are advised to apply for multiple entry visas. Visitors must have a return ticket. It is essential that you check current visa and medical requirements at your local embassy or consulate of the country you intend to visit, prior to traveling. Please make a copy of your front and back pages of your passport. Have a copy in your luggage and one at home. Currently: Travelers from the United States are NOT required to obtain an entry visa for South Africa.

Post-Tour Participants - A One-Time Entry Visa is REQUIRED for Zimbabwe. The fee for this visa is approximately \$30 USD and will be
applied to your final payment invoice.

WHAT VACCINATIONS (IF ANY) WILL I NEED? CDC recommends that travelers going to certain areas of South Africa take prescription medicine to prevent malaria. Depending on the medicine you take, you will need to start taking this medicine multiple days before your trip, as well as during and after your trip. Talk to your doctor about which (if any) precautions you should take.

As of the writing of this statement, NO specific vaccinations are REQUIRED to enter South Africa, Kingdom of eSwatini, &/or Zambia Any updates to requirements will be advised at that time

WHAT WILL THE WEATHER BE LIKE? As late winter transitions to early spring and the thermometer mercury is rising, temperatures remain cool across most of the country and the higher mountains remain covered in snow. The exception is Durban and the KwaZulu-Natal coast, which stay warm, and Kruger is ideal for game viewing. However, pack some cold-weather clothing for early morning game drives, as nights can drop to freezing. With such varying temperatures, bring lots of layers!! At a very mild average of 63°F, Cape Town is distinctly chilly, as is Johannesburg at 68°F, while Kruger averages 79°F.

WHAT TYPE OF CLOTHING WILL I NEED? Casual, comfortable clothing, binoculars, and your sense of adventure are essential for your safari. *Muted color, lightweight clothing is best for game viewing.* Game drives are generally conducted in the early morning and the late afternoon, which can be cold, especially in winter (August). The temperature often warms up during the day, so it is best to dress in layers.

- Clothes in khaki, green, beige and neutral colors
- T-shirts
- Shorts or a light skirt; Jeans or safari trousers for evenings and cooler days
- Jackets, fleece, sweaters for early morning and late afternoon game drives; A lightweight waterproof jacket in case of rain
- Comfortable walking shoes or sneakers
- Hat or baseball cap
- Warm scarf or pashmina; Gloves or mittens
- LAYERS! LAYERS! LAYERS!

HOW LONG IS THE FLIGHT TO SOUTH AFRICA? Normally, it takes 15-18 hours based on flight scheduling. Schedules will be available about 6 months prior to travel. This means you have time for multiple movies, eating multiple meals, reading your book, and sleeping!

• **Are Flight Upgrades Available?** Based on availability, there will be an additional fee. For premium economy seats, it is usually between \$600-800 per person additional, and for business class, approximately an additional \$4,000 per person.

WHAT ARE THE HOTELS LIKE ON THIS TOUR? The hotels and lodges are generally what we would consider to be 3 or 4 stars with modern amenities you would expect: En suite bathrooms, hot showers, comfortable beds, hairdryers, and some spectacular views.

 traditional African feasts are enjoyed under African starry skies.
- Hotel Mbabane (1 Night): Mountain View International Hotel Conveniently located just 2 km from Mbabane off the Mbabane / Manzini highway, The Mountain Inn is ideally situated to discover all Swaziland has to offer. This family owned and operated hotel has unrivaled views over the Ezulwini Valley (Valley of Heaven). Sip cocktails on our deck overlooking this Grand Valley and dine al fresco or in our Cosy Grill restaurant. Enjoy our Pool with a view, outdoor chess, rub shoulders with our local patrons at O'Reilly's Sports Pub or just enjoy our hospitality. WHAT IS THE FOOD LIKE? The food in southern Africa is excellent! Most meals will be buffets, so you'll have the freedom to try a little of everything. The cuisine is an eclectic mix of Dutch, British, Indian, and native African, like chicken, beef, fish, rice, and excellenT breads! You surely won't go hungry!

WHAT IS THE LOCAL CURRENCY & CAN I USE MY CREDIT CARDS? The South African Rand (ZAR) is the local currency and will be needed for local purchases (meals not included & souvenirs), as most small shops & restaurants do not accept credit cards. A currency order form will be provided with your final payment, if you would prefer World of Travel to order your currency. The *current* exchange rate is 1 USD = 17.10 ZAR

HOW MUCH WALKING WILL THERE BE, AND WHAT ISSUES SHOULD I BE AWARE OF? There isn't too much walking, though you DO have to be physically able to get on and off the vehicles and walk short distances. Most of the walking is over flat terrain. Although we don't climb any mountains, some of the places are up to a mile high (similar altitude to Denver, Colorado).

WHAT ANIMALS COULD I EXPECT TO SEE? Zebras, elephants, warthogs, elands, lions, penguins, and more!

WHAT MAKES THIS TOUR DIFFERENT THAN MOST? This tour is a combination of sightseeing and game viewing whereas most safari programs are primarily game viewing. You will be seeing all of the highlights of South Africa in a deluxe motorcoach in the cities and in smaller vans with open roofs while game viewing. In addition, you will see a Penguin Colony.

Cancelation Schedule: All cancelations must be received in writing. Cancelations received before May 24th, 2024 are subject to an administration fee of \$100 per person. Cancelations received after May 24th, 2024 are non-refundable.

Passport: A valid passport is required to participate in this program. Your passport must be valid for at least 6 months upon return. A copy of your passport will need to be provided to World of Travel, prior to travel.

Traveling with Minors: South Africa has implemented regulations for families traveling into or out of the country with children under the age of 18. Amongst others, minors are required to have an unabridged birth certificate reflecting the particulars of the parents of the child. Specific documents are required depending on the circumstances of the minor traveling. If a minor is traveling with anyone other than their parents, a notarized letter or affidavit confirming the child's permission to travel to South Africa with the non-parent adult is required, along with copies of the identity documents or passports of the parents or legal guardian of the minor. Please note that this information should be used as a guide only and is subject to change.

Checked Baggage -OR Tambo International Airport (Johannesburg): The following important rules for checked baggage will be applied at OR Tambo International Airport in Johannesburg:

- Only regular-shaped bags will be allowed to be checked in Bags must have at least one flat surface to be accepted
- Round or irregular-shaped bags will not be allowed
- Bags with longs straps will not be allowed

These rules are implemented in order to prevent blockages and breakdowns in the baggage handling system caused by bags that do not have any flat surfaces or that have long straps or grips. Passengers who try to check in bags that do not conform to these rules will have the option of having their baggage wrapped with one flat side at airport approved baggage wrapping stations - Any additional cost for this wrapping service will be at the traveler's expense.

Travel/Health Policy: It is required that persons needing assistance be accompanied by a companion who is capable and totally responsible for providing that assistance. Neither World of Travel nor its suppliers may assist with medications, wheelchairs, or physically lift persons onto transportation vehicles.
