Day-by-Day in Detail

<u>Friday, July 5th - Today, we will fly to Vancouver, BC - Upon arrival, check into our hotel for 1 night and dinner will be on your own.</u>

<u>Saturday, July 6</u>th CRUISE EMBARKATION - Following breakfast, we will transfer via motor coach to Canada Place Cruise Terminal. Here, we will board the Sapphire Princess and embark on our magnificent 7-night journey through Alaska's glaciers.

<u>Sunday, July 7th</u> DAY AT SEA - Settle into your cruise with a relaxing day at sea. Explore the ship's shops, stroll through The Piazza, perfect your putt on the miniature golf course, take a dip in the hot tub, or relax by the pool.

<u>Monday, July 8th KETCHIKAN, ALASKA</u> - Known for its timber, Ketchikan hosts the Great Alaskan Lumberjack Show, where athletes throw, race and chop their way to victory. Explore one of the world's oldest collections of totem poles at the Totem Pole Heritage Center, or stroll along Creek Street. As the salmon capital of the world, Ketchikan's waters make for incredible fishing. *Arrive:* 6:00am - Depart 2:00pm. Shore excursion options will be available closer to travel.

<u>Tuesday, July 9</u>th JUNEAU, ALASKA - With its snow-capped mountains, misty rainforests, massive glaciers and bounty of wildlife, Alaska's remote state capital is the perfect place to dive into nature. Framed by Mount Juneau and Mount Roberts, the city's picturesque downtown area offers centuries-old bars, boutique shops and historic landmarks. For a taste of the local culture, visit the historic district and the Alaska State Museum. And for outdoor thrills, you can take your pick of activities ranging from whale watching in Auke Bay Harbor to tundra trekking over Mendenhall Glacier, and even try your hand at gold panning in Last Chance Basin. *Arrive: 8:00am - Depart 9:00pm. Shore excursion options will be available closer to travel.*


<u>Wednesday. July 10</u>th SKAGWAY, ALASKA - The tiny town of Skagway still looks like it did during the Klondike Gold Rush over 100 years ago and today it remains an outpost for thrilling Alaskan adventure. An old-time street car ride along bustling Broadway Street reveals well-preserved buildings, including the state's oldest hotel. You can see engraved walrus tusks at the Corrington Museum, or get lost in riveting historical reenactments around town. If outdoor adventure is more your thing, there are plenty of ways to amp up the adrenaline, from sledding with Alaskan Huskies on Laughton Glacier to rafting Lynn Canal, the longest fjord in North America. *Arrive: 7:00am - Depart 8:30pm. Shore excursion options will be available closer to travel.*

<u>Thursday, July 11th GLACIER BAY NATIONAL PARK SCENIC CRUISING</u> - Sail through one of the most iconic locations in the Great Land -Glacier Bay National Park. Listen to Margerie Glacier's signature crack and boom rumble across the waves. Bring binoculars and scan both the shore and the waves for wildlife like brown bears and migrating whales while Park Rangers teach you the history and geology of the park. <u>Friday, July 12th COLLEGE FJORD SCENIC CRUISING</u> - College Fjord is the meeting place where many of Alaska's glaciers congregate and flow to the ocean. At the water's edge are massive valley glaciers and dozens of smaller monuments that dot the mountainous region. Thanks to the professors who first settled here in 1899, many of these glaciers are named after the country's best institutions of higher learning, such as Harvard Glacier. <u>Saturday. July 13th DISEMBARKATION</u> - This morning, enjoy one last breakfast onboard the ship before disembarkation. We will then enjoy an Anchorage city tour before heading to the airport for our return (overnight) flights to Columbus.

Sunday, July 14th - We will arrive in Columbus *early* this morning.






